If your child (or anyone in your household) has symptoms, you must arrange a test as soon as possible and isolate at home for **10 days** from date of onset of symptoms (or until they receive a negative result).

Everyone else in the household who does not have symptoms must isolate at home for 14 days (or until the symptomatic household member receives a negative result).

The child will need to be tested before they can return to school.

You will be offered a test at your closest drive-through centre. This is the quickest option. A parent or carer will need to perform the test on children under 12 years old.

If you don't drive, you can request a home test kit.

Do not get a taxi or public transport to the test centre.
