PE and Sports Funding- Impact Statement 2016/7

From DfE guidance, Prior Weston chose to prioritise the funding in 2016/2017 under the following headings:

- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help teach PE and sport more effectively. Enhanced PE SLA provides staff training for all PE.
- Outdoor resources purchased for Reception classes to encourage physical activity
- New morning and after school clubs provide additional opportunities for physical opportunities
- Coaches introduced to improve quality of sports provision in holiday play scheme
- Support staff member allocated to support PE sessions.

Funding received £9, 500

- Full SLA agreement with Islington for PE – £4,000
- Purchase additional equipment for lower school playground £2,000
- Enhance sporting activities available in extended school - £1000
- TA to focus on PE – £2,500

Buying the full SLA package

The buying of the full package gives the school dedicated days with a PE specialist and enables the school to join all competitions within Islington. We used the dedicated days from the borough's PE specialist to come into school to support/disseminate training to the PE teacher and other staff who then rolled this out to other staff within the school. This has increased teacher and support staff confidence in teaching PE across the school and has led to greater progress for children.

Teachers had support in the new units introduced this year which include Paralympic sports, ultimate Frisbee and Crazy Catch. Our PE specialist teacher observed lessons after the support and the class teacher seemed very confident in teaching the subject. Other staff were surveyed and reported the same.

A new PE curriculum was introduced which included new units of work where teachers taught a different sport every half term. Teachers fed back to the PE specialist teacher that they enjoyed teaching the new range of activities and the children certainly enjoyed learning new skills and tactics, and playing new games.

Purchase of additional equipment for lower school and whole school playground

Climbing equipment has been in regular use in the KS1 playground and has encouraged students to be more active.

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The whole school playground has been re designed by our PE specialist teacher and new equipment was purchased for the different areas of play. Students have been more active and behaviour has improved at playtime.

Enhance sporting activities available in extended school

Sports clubs have run every day after school, quite often more than one sports club per day. The students have had opportunities to attend regular fixtures which quite often run on a weekly basis. Specialist coaches have been brought in to run extra sports clubs including football, gymnastics, netball and tag rugby.

Teaching Assistant to focus on PE

The TA linked with PE has attended many sports fixtures, has run early morning sports clubs and supported in PE lessons, enabling greater participation in regular activity and supporting children to improve their skills during lessons.
